Jill Newton Moore Bio: In 2019 I retired from my position as a Professor in the Communication Department at Alverno College, where I developed and taught beginning darkroom photography; advanced darkroom techniques, digital photography, and social justice photography. I've also taught photography for Arts at Large, the Girl Scouts iCamp, and the Essence Project. I began a photography club at James Madison High School and Escuela Verde High School. Many of my former students have become professional photographers, a fact I am extremely proud of.

My work has always had a strong social justice focus, and I've been lucky to be the recipient of grants from CoPA, The Clinton Foundation, and the Department of Education to pursue this work. I have been the photographer for several non-profits including the Alverno College Leadership Project for Girls (Cameroon); Feeding Mouths, Filling Minds (Cameroon and Sierra Leone); and The MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary, where a position was recently created for me as the Communication & Social Media Specialist.

One of the greatest joys I have had as a photographer is taking groups on more than a dozen photo excursions to London and Paris, Ireland, and Costa Rica. These are a blend of teaching, learning, and doing. It's a delight to help others build and refine their photography skills in such image-rich environments.

My own work has been shown in exhibits, used on records, posters, book covers, and for fundraising and PR. As an independent freelance photographer, I shoot weddings, family events and gatherings, graduations, and public events.

I've been a competition judge for WACCO, Wehr Nature Center, the Urban Ecology Center, MPS, Alverno, and probably places I've forgotten. As a competition judge, I look for excellence demonstrated in the aesthetics of composition; precision in technical aspects of images; creative approaches to subject matter; originality that avoids visual clichés; and narrative strength.

Dues are due!! Please do not forget to bring the annual due of \$20 to the January meeting. You will not be allowed to compete without paying your dues.

While we have all loved our mascot, Otis the Owl, for a very long time, it is time we retire him. We, of course, will need another logo to replace him with. Please think about what the mission of WNCCC is and what we want to promote about WNCCC. I was thinking a simpler logo might freshen up our look. This is not something that needs to be done right away, but if anyone has some skill in graphic design, and could use that to create a new logo, it would be appreciated.

Photo Challenge of the month: We are slightly modifying this activity. The schedule and topics will be listed on the club's calendar. All Pollunits will open on the second Saturday of the month (the day of our regularly scheduled meeting). You will have two weeks to up load an image, and then, a week to vote. Topics will still be announced here and in the meeting in addition to the calendar.

The monthly challenge in November will be a best of the best. All the first place winners will be put in a PollUnit and the members will score these images to determine which the top 3 of the year are. This will have increased points, 30 points for First Place; 20 points for Second Place and 10 points for Third Place.

The April Challenge will be: Leading Lines

If any member cannot upload images to the Pollunit, that person can send me (trekkielaw@aol.com) the image they want to enter and I will upload it for them.

The top three winning images will be awarded:

1st Place – 5 points

2nd Place – 4 points

3rd Place – 3 points

Every entry will receive 1 point.

The scores will be tracked for the WNCCC Photographer of 2022, who will receive free dues for 2023.

Points for Photographer of 2022 will also be awarded for entering the club competition (1 point for each image), 5 points for proposing an outing or meeting topic, and 10 points for actually leading the outing or organizing the speaker for the meeting. (Limited to 20 points). Points may be awarded for other reasons also.

When submitting your images, please change the file name to include your name as the first information in the file name and mention that this is for the image sharing in the email subject line. Also, resize your images so that the longest side is 1400 pixels, with a maximum file size of 2 mb. This will help to streamline the process of viewing member images.

Club Competition: Will be judged in March this year. As such, the Poll Units will open for uploads NOW and close on March 17th at midnight. Judging will be March 18th to March 25th.

All images should be titled Last Name Category Title.

- 1) Digital:
 - a) -Images should be titled as above.
 - b) -2100 pixels on the longest side and no more than 3 MB
 - c) -Categories are:
 - i) Nature Digital Color
 - ii) Open Digital Color
 - iii) Open Monochrome/B&W
 - iv) Special Category Nature - Reptiles, Amphibians, Insects
 - v) Special Category Open – Photojournalism/Sports

- 2) Newly resumed – **PRINTS!!**
 - a) No Larger than 16x20; no smaller than 5x7
 - b) Must be framed or mounted
 - c) Judged in person on April 1st so, bring them to the meeting
 - d) Categories are:
 - i) Open Color
 - ii) Open Monochrome/B&W
 - iii) Nature (either color or Mono)

We will have the Judges in person on April 1st to judge the prints and talk about the scores for the digital images.

Two members will need to sign up to be present at Inspiration Studios each time we will have the Gallery open. The schedule has yet to be determined. **START YOUR PRINTING!
