Why I love using my Lensbaby Sol 45 lens. by Dawn Schmitt:








If you're looking for tack sharp photos from corner to corner the Lensbaby lenses are not for you. Lensbaby lens are manual focus lenses and have a sweet spot of focus and the rest of the lens is distorted, purposely out of focus. This adds creativity and fun to photography. If you want to enter competitions then you don't want to use this type of lenses. I was very impressed with this lens when I went to the Out of Chicago botanical gardens photo workshop with Ann Belmont in 2021. I was hooked and purchased my first Lensbaby lenses because of the workshop. I now own 5 Lensbaby lens and love them all for their different creativity aspect. Membership Dues: Annual membership dues are \$20. <u>Dues will be due at the</u> <u>January meeting.</u>

This is a good time to consider becoming a member of the Friends of Wehr for \$30. This entitles you to free parking and it supports the Nature Center.

We will be meeting monthly on the second Saturday of each month for the entire year, including July and August.

Remove film from box and load camera. Remove film box from puppy's mouth and throw in trash.

Remove puppy from trash and brush coffee grounds from muzzle.

- Choose a suitable background for photo.
- Mount camera on tripod and focus. Find puppy and take dirty sock from mouth.
- Place puppy in pre-focused spot and return to camera.
- Forget about spot and crawl after puppy on knees.
- Focus with one hand and fend off puppy with other hand.

- Get tissue and clean nose print from lens. Put cat outside and put peroxide on the scratch on puppy's nose.
- Put magazines back on coffee table.

Try to get puppy's attention by squeaking toy over your head.

Replace your glasses and check camera for damage.

Jump up in time to grab puppy by scruff of neck and say, "No, outside! No, outside!" Call someone to help clean up mess.

Sit back in La-Z-Boy[™] for deep breathing, and resolve to teach puppy "sit" and "stay" first thing in the morning.
